

Prince Marc de Beauvau-Craon, Grand Constable of Lorraine and a close friend of Duke Leopold I, took ownership of the land on which Haroué is built in 1720.

He commissioned the architect Germain Boffrand to build his family home there. Set in the middle of a 16-hectare estate, the château is a masterpiece of 18th-century architecture. Still inhabited by the de Beauvau-Craon family to this day, it is a living testimony to the tastes and way of life of a noble Lorraine family. The Centre des monuments nationaux opened the Château de Haroué to the public in 2021 as part of a

partnership with the de Beauvau-Craon family.

DID YOU KNOW...?

Haroué is a symbol of the passage of time, with its 365 windows, 52 chimneys, 12 towers and 4 bridges.
